Hi there,

We here at Cliona's Foundation hope you're well and getting a chance to enjoy the summer - despite the weather! If you're not in touch with us via the various social media options, well this Newsletter will keep you up to date on all that's been going on for us over the last 6 months. Thankfully we've been kept very busy with numerous fundraisers and that in turn has allowed Cliona's Foundation to help several families seeking financial assistance whilst caring for a child with a life limiting condition.

People have been unbelievably generous with their time and money over the past 6 months and we have been overwhelmed with the level of support that we have received from individuals and all sectors of the community.

We're very proud to say that, this year alone 36 families have received funding from us and in total, since the inception of Cliona's Foundation the total is 336 families. We think it's fair to say that's a lot of families, that's a lot of fundraising and noticeably, these families are spread throughout all of Ireland, we expect that makes us a national charity. It is fantastic to get feedback from some of these families on what the support has meant to them and it is this feedback that continues to drive us forward.

In January of this year, we passed the €1,000,000.00 figure raised which allowed us celebrate this at our Annual Social in Bulgaden Castle Co. Limerick. Keith Duffy and his lovely wife Lisa were our guests this year. Once again, it was a great night. In fact Keith is so passionate about Cliona's Foundation that he has supported us at several events already this year; he co-mc'd Sparkle & Shine Ball with our fantastic patron Miriam O' Callaghan; he cycled from Nantes to Lourdes with 18 other cyclists and 6 back up crew and there is a Golf Classic coming up which Keith is involved in and has committed to donating some of the funds raised to us.

Cliona's Foundation is one of 5 charities chosen by the GAA for 2016. We were really excited when we received this news and also delighted to have been in Croke Park on Sun 31st July for the Football Quarter Finals to say a few words about Cliona's Foundation.

Before we sign off, it would be remiss of us not to address the unsettling issues surrounding certain charities at the moment. We were really disappointed to hear about the mishandling of funds by individuals in authority at a recognized charity recently. We want to take this opportunity to reassure our supporters, donors, fundraisers, volunteers and more that all funds raised for Cliona's Foundation go directly to the families. Of course we have outgoings in connection with the day to day running of the charity but this is necessary to allow us continue with our valuable work.

We can also tell you that Cliona's Foundation is on the Governance Code Journey. The Governance Code is a code of practice for good governance of community, voluntary and charitable organisations in Ireland. We have signed up to adopting this Code and are on the adoption journey to being fully compliant with the help of Roseanne Dunne

We'd like to welcome Phil Deegan on board. Phil joined us in March after a long period with Shannon Development in a number of key roles which included Tourism Product Development and Industrial Property Management and is settling great in to the job. We have a really generous and kind Landlord and we'd like to thank PJ Noonan and the girls in Roselawn House for their support.

Cliona's Foundation hits the €1m in Bulgaden

We celebrated our 9th anniversary on Saturday 23rd January in Bulgaden Castle, Co. Limerick. with a massive bang. The annual celebratory night is a permanent fixture in the diaries of many and each year it gives the charity the opportunity to thank those who have enabled Cliona's Foundation to donate much needed funding to families of children with a life limiting illness

This year's event was made extra special as we were delighted to have singer, actor and philanthropist Keith Duffy as our guest and were also thrilled to announce that the Foundation had reached a massive milestone and had just hit the €1,000,000 fundraising mark. Keith and his beautiful wife Lisa were greeted with huge excitement when presented to the crowd in excess of 300 by our fantastic MC Tom Tierney. Keith did not disappoint and he chatted with both young and old and stood in for photographs with nearly every one that was there to their huge delight.

While doing a Q&A Keith mentioned how during the week Brendan and Terry Ring, charity founders, sent him old photos of Cliona and himself meeting many years ago at a Boyzone concert. Keith felt that Cliona brought him and the Foundation together and he told the crowd that Cliona and his good friend Stephen Gately were now "watching over them like two angels in heaven".

It was humbling and emotional to see the crowd give a standing ovation when the cheque of €1,000,000 was displayed, particularly as there were a lot of family and friends in attendance that have played a key

role in the Foundations journey for the past 9 years.

In addition to Keith and Lisa Duffy we were delighted to have both Richard Lynch and the Rose of Scotland Brid Madigan, a native of Ballyneety join our celebrations. Brid continuously promoted the Foundation during her time as Rose of Scotland and gave us a huge endorsement live from the Dome in Tralee last August. Nantes to Lourdes

Doing the distance for Clionas Foundation

While most people's focus in June was on the Euros in France we had our own boys in green cycling through France from Nantes to Lourdes to raise monies for Cliona's Foundation and The Limerick Lourdes Pilgrimage Trust. This is the 4th year that this mammoth cycle has been undertaken in the direction of Fergal Deegan and his outstanding committee and the 2nd time Cliona's Foundation has been the beneficiary. It involved a team of 19 supported by a back up crew of 6 cycling 800Km over 6 days taking in the very scenic La Rochelle and Bordeaux in the good company along the route of thousands of Irish soccer supporters. It was also the 2nd time our own Brendan Ring has cycled, along with another great Cliona's Foundation supporter Martin Hartnett and while conditions were very tough at times the mix of personalities, and the support given to each other made this a hugely emotional, personal, unique and enriching experience for everyone involved – in addition to being shattering!!

What started out as banter and a very off the cuff comment at the launch of the cycle saw the very popular Keith Duffy of Boyzone and Coronation Street fame jump on his bike, and make the full trip with the rest of the team. His popularity and interaction with the fans encountered en route saw Cliona's Foundation getting huge profile on national media throughout the 6 days. In particular the recording of him with fans on the streets of La Rochelle went viral, resulting in numerous media interviews. In all of these he very strongly profiled Cliona's Foundation, and following his piece with Ryan Tubridy our Text to Cliona's no received substantial support. An impromptu sing song in the Cycle teams hotel in Bordeaux which was thronged with a mix of soccer supporters saw

a bucket being passed around resulting in €500 being collected.

But it was a huge team effort, with tears and laughter, cyclists being picked up mentally and physically, busted tubes and buckled wheels, wet gear and sun cream, water and beer, power bars and power naps, daily media interviews and daily Mass, Boyzlife and sing songs and some great performances on and off the bike.

Arriving in to Lourdes to be greeted by a large number of friends and family was very emotional for all the team, emotions which were hard to contain when heartfelt words were spoken by Brendan Ring and Finbarr Brougham (Team leader) outside the Alba Hotel. Cliona's Foundation were honoured to be selected as beneficiary and Brendan Ring was humbled to be in company of a great group of people all of whom made personal sacrifices to do what they did and raise what will be substantial monies for Cliona's Foundation and the Limerick Lourdes Pilgrimage Trust.

It is difficult to truly express the gratitude we have for all the team including the one solo female member Sarah Deegan for what their efforts and commitment mean to us.

"At this stage each and every one of the gang had tears in their eyes. Some more than others but we all knew that this adventure of ours was at an end. With lumps in our throats a few words were spoken and we mounted our bikes for one last time and took to the last ride in together. Arriving at the hotel with friends and family being there was a fantastic end to an amazing adventure. EPIC Journey

Malin to Mizen in 24 hours by Cliona' Foundation Cycle Club

Malin to Mizen nonstop: departed Malin 10:30 am Saturday 11th of June. Arrived Mizen Head Sunday 12th June 12:45 pm. Cycle time 21 Hours 31 Minutes: 594 Kilometres. How unbelievable is the commitment, and strength of body and mind this fantastic group of cyclists and back up crew demonstrated in undertaking this massive journey.

The team gathered on Friday morning and were cheered off by the children in Lough Gur National School and a group of hardy supporters as they headed to Malin to kick start the journey the following morning. At 10.30 on Saturday the 11th June 10:30 am the lads hit the road and the fun started. First stop Enniskillen followed by Athlone where the chef in the hotel held back to ensure the team were fed and watered when they eventually arrived at 9.30pm. A long few hours in pitch darkness followed on route to Charleville with only the odd glimmer of light from the bikes and the reassuring words on the radio from their road Captain.

But in Nenagh reinforcements came on board, - eight cyclists from Mallow come out of the dark like guardian angels to help the cyclists charge through the night towards Bruff (staying with them until Kanturk). The stretch from Bird Hill to Charleville saw the team get phenomenal support from family and friends at numerous locations. A great boost for them all which carried them into Charleville at 4am to a tremendous welcome.

On from Charleville to Dunmanaway moving through the spectacular landscape of West



Cork in splendid sunshine (finally) with a sense of relief. Following quick break in Dunmanaway to refuel and gather their thoughts they took off on the relentless roads of Mizen safe in the knowledge they would finish it.

Arriving in to Malin at 12.45pm was naturally emotional for them, greeted by their families, exhausted bodies and minds but with a massive sense of achievement. Mission accomplished.

We are hugely indebted to this group for what they have achieved not only over the 2 intense days but also in the months leading up to their journey through the various fundraising events they organised. A huge thank you to all the team consisting of 6 cyclists Andrew Mc Namara, Ken McEvoy, Malachy Carew, Brian Mc Namara, Gary O Sullivan, Derek Connaughton, the fantastic support team and everyone that supported them in any way.

"It is difficult to sum up an epic journey in words; it was made up of moments of worry, happiness, joy and laughter, on our trip from Malin to Mizen. But most of all satisfaction, the satisfaction of knowing that a job was well done and that the legacy of a girl called Cliona was protected by the people who are proud to cycle with her name on their jerseys."



Our Families **The Mc Ginnis Family**

We want to share with you a piece on one of the families we have been able to help and we thank them for sharing their story with us. The McGinnis family story highlights the struggle families face in caring for a sick child but also how much Cliona's Foundation support means to them and the difference it can make.

When Brendan McGinnis was born, doctors told his mother Tracy he was perfect. Today the brave 11-and-a-half year-old is severely disabled, suffering from epilepsy, scoliosis (a spinal deformity) and lung disease. Mum Tracy, who wanted to tell their story to pay tribute to Cliona's Foundation, said a common virus that affects 80% of the population by the time that they reach 40 years of age attacked Brendan while he was still in the womb.

Tracy McGinnis said: "At first Brendan seemed perfect, everything about him looked normal. But when he was examined at two weeks of age, doctors discovered he had microcephaly. Microcephaly is an extremely rare condition that causes a child's head to be smaller it should be for stage of development. This congenital condition is also associated with incomplete brain development." Tracy soon discovered this was just one of the health problems caused by Cytomegalovirus CMV, a common childhood illness that she caught while pregnant with her son.

Tracy said:
"Cytomegalovirus affects most people in their life. In fact doctors believe 80% of the world's population catch it by the time they reach 40 years of age. It's a very common childhood illness too. Most people presume they have flu because the symptoms are similar, you run a temperature, have aches and pains and you feel sluggish. But if you're pregnant when you catch it there is a one in three chance that your child will be affected."

Brendan needs 24 hour care as he can stop breathing when he suffers from a seizure and was on the verge of starving to death last year as he could no longer take food.

Brendan has deteriorated since he was a toddler – at three-and-a-half Brendan could stand, fully assisted by a standing frame, hold a toy and even eat pureed food. Now he is non-verbal and confined to a hospital bed or his wheelchair. He is unfit to travel very far as a two hour drive can be extremely taxing on him.

Tracy said:

"Cliona's Foundation has been a fantastic support. The funding they have given me has helped me to buy groceries, pay the electricity bill, pay rent, buy kerosene for my central heating – Cliona's Foundation literally helped me to survive. It's very expensive having a child in hospital, between parking charges, buying food in the café as the hospital obviously don't provide food for parents, and then paying a childminder to look after my other son Declan, who is seven. In fact at one point Crumlin Children's Hospital ended up admitting Declan to hospital so that he could stay with me and Brendan as I had literally nowhere else for him to go."

Sarah was hugely popular when she appeared on stage at Stars Choirs & Carols in Croke Park with Miriam O'Callaghan in December 2013. Our deepest condolences to her wonderful parents David & Mary and her devoted brother Jimmy

Alexandra Costa Burke was born healthy on the 4th of March 2010, but was diagnosed with an aggressive brain tumour in November 2011. At the time she was given three weeks to live by the doctors in Crumlin. But Alexandra was a warrior and along with her mum Tracy and the support of her wider family members she travelled between Crumlin Hospital and the Limerick Regional Hospital to undergo very intensive chemotherapy and treatment. She made it through her treatment, made a great recovery and appeared as a very happy healthy 5 year old in a feature on Cliona's Foundation on Nationwide in August 2015. In October 2015 the tumour re-emerged and despite putting up a valiant fight, Alexandra sadly passed away in February of this year. Her family have been ambassadors and supporters of Cliona's Foundation throughout her illness and treatment and we extend our deepest condolence to her Mum Tracy, sister Vanessa and her very extensive family and friends


Shedding the Pounds for Charity
