As many of you may be aware Cliona's Foundation was established in memory of Brendan & Terry's daughter Cliona who passed away from an inoperable brain tumor. We wanted to tell you more about Cliona and the amazing girl that she was.

Cliona loved music. She took music lessons on the tin whistle and the piano. But any time of the day or night, she would have songs and music playing in her room and she could be heard downstairs singing along to the tunes. Several evenings a week, she would get around her dad Brendan and he would have to take her for a drive and her brother Colm & her Mam Terry would always know when they were arriving home i.e. the music in the car would be turned up full blast coming in the driveway....

While Cliona wasn't a huge fan of school, we think the only reason she attended school was for the social aspect. She absolutely loved meeting her school friends, teachers and all other staff in both her National School and Secondary School. In fact when the Teachers from St. John the Baptist Secondary School visited Lough Gur National School to inform the 6th Class of what might be in store for them going into First Year, Cliona had a very important question for Mrs. Jones. Was it possible to get an exemption from Irish and French classes? True to form, Cliona received her exemption from both Irish and French Class!!!!!

Cliona loved writing. If there was ever an issue getting her down or she had become upset about something, she would write down her feelings on a note and she made sure to leave it in a place where it would be obviously seen and read. This was her way of dealing with life. Even after her death, we found numerous notes throughout our home that she had written and for one reason or another, chose to leave them where there would eventually be found.

Cliona's Foundation can present you with a certificate that you can present to your loved one on Christmas morning to show them that you have made a donation in their name to Cliona's Foundation.



### Eoghan, another one of Cliona's Foundation's little fighters



Eoghan was born last December in Limerick; he was 8 weeks premature and immediately went into respiratory failure. Eoghan stayed in intensive care in hospital for 4 weeks until it was felt he was strong enough to be able to go home, much to the relief of his mother Pauline.

Unfortunately after only being at home for a few days Eoghan

developed pneumonia and had to be readmitted to high dependency. This cycle of going in and out of hospital continued for the next few weeks. With Eoghan eventually being transferred to Crumlins Children's Hospital, it was discovered that Eoghan also had a heart murmur and problems with his digestive tract - Eoghan has had to be tube fed since he was 9 weeks old.

For weeks on end Pauline would not leave the hospital, eating and sleeping there as she did not want to leave Eoghan's side, her husband stayed in Limerick to care for their other 2 year old son, Diarmuid. Pauline's husband was only able to come to Dublin to see them at weekends where he often had to make the choice to leave Diarmuid with babysitters.

Pauline's family were under severe strain emotionally, physically and financially, together with the additional costs of living in separate cities, travel, babysitters and crèche fees along with the fact of trying to keep up with their day to day fees of maintaining their home, were crippling the family.

One of the nurses in the hospital told Pauline about the work that Cliona's Foundation does and Pauline applied for financial help from the Foundation. Cliona's Foundation was able to support Pauline providing her with money to help her to keep on top of their mounting costs.

"I cannot thank Cliona's Foundation enough for the support that they have given to my family, I was able to stop stressing about how we were going to be able to pay our bills and concentrate on being there for Eoghan."

Eoghan continues to have ongoing respiratory issues but Pauline has been able to bring him home to Limerick where he is getting to know his older brother.

There are hundreds of families in Ireland who are in a similar situation to Pauline's and they need our help. When a family has a sick child they should not have to struggle under the additional stress of worrying whether or not they can pay their

While Cliona's Foundation cannot cure a child, we want to help them cope and soften their heart-breaking journey, by providing financial assistance to families who have exhausted all other resources. Cliona's Foundation believes that no family should have to face any added financial stress when they are already struggling to cope with the devastation and trauma of a terminally ill child.

Over the last few months there have been some amazing Fundraisers for Cliona's Foundation. As we do not receive any state funding, Cliona's Foundation are completely reliant on fundraising events and personal donations.

### Jayden an Irish warrior in Sweden

Jayden was born on the 16th of September with a condition called CDH. This condition means that Jayden's abdominal organs were pushing up into his lungs, stopping his lungs from developing and restricting his breathing.

Immediately after being born Jayden was flown to a hospital in Sweden for surgery. Cliona's Foundation were able to provide his parents with funding so that they could be in Sweden with him and also so that they would not have to worry about bills at home.

Jayden spent weeks in Sweden on a heart and lung machine and only recently was transferred back to Crumlin Hospital in Dublin. He truly is a little fighter and has been nicknamed by the nurses - The Irish Warrior. Jayden has since been taken off the heart and lung machine and is getting stronger every day – he is even wearing his own clothes now. He still has a long road ahead of him but hopefully he will be able to come home soon. We are in regular contact with Jayden's parents and keep him in our thoughts every day.





