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## Cliona's scoops Aviva Community Broker Fund Prize

Cliona's Foundation were thrilled to come out joint winners in the 2019 National Aviva Broker Community Fund following a presentation to the judging panel in Dublin recently.

Aviva launched the Aviva Broker Community Fund in 2017 to collaborate with their Broker partners in identifying local charitable and community causes that will make a difference to the community.

Cliona's was nominated by a number of brokers, but it was the nomination by Nolan & Partners Financial Advisers that was shortlisted to the final 5 and guaranteed a fund of €5,000.



Each of the five charities shortlisted presented their plans to the independent panel of judges, which included former rugby player, Bernard Jackman, representatives from Matheson and an executive from Charities Trust to be in with a chance of the overall prize.

The outcome of the deliberations from the panel was that it was a draw between Cliona's Foundation and another Limerick Charity Irish Chamber Orchestra – Sing out with Strings for the €20,000 prize fund – with each of the charities being awarded €12,500.

To say we were absolutely ecstatic on the day would be an understatement as this was recognition of our work on a national front in addition to funds that would help a number of families.

# The Blue Brigade making dreams come true



### How families of Ireland's sickest children can fall into a financial black hole

Cliona's Foundation vision is that no family should suffer financially while having to care for their seriously sick child – however unfortunately for many of the families of the 4,000 children in Ireland with a life limiting condition this is not the case.



On top of grieving for the loss of a normal future for their seriously unwell child comes the financial pressure.

In our academic report "Too Dear to Visit " launched last year and presented to various Government department officials we highlighted the issue of the huge non medical costs associated with caring for a sick child and the lack of supports available to families to meet these hidden costs . Many of these families are being driven in to poverty.

Cliona's Foundation has for the past 12 years been trying to help these families by providing once off financial support to enable them meet some of the ongoing long term costs. We are the only charity in Ireland providing this support on a national basis from birth up to 16 years of age across all life limiting conditions. We are doing this without any Government funding but with the fantastic generosity of the general public. Naturally we would love to be able to do so much more.

The families we are supporting and the issues facing them was further highlighted in a recent article in the Irish Times in May which looked at the experience of one family and also got the views of the Nurses and Social Workers trying to help them. The following extracts from this article will give you some insight into the struggle and why we are so passionate about helping these families. "On top of grieving for the loss of a normal future for their seriously unwell child comes the financial pressure of trying to pay regular bills on a reduced income, while bearing increased costs that living in hospital brings – from accommodation, travel and parking, to eating without cooking facilities and often extra childcare for siblings."

"We are dealing with the sickest children in the country and the parents under the most strain, and then we are adding into the mix that they are being put under extreme financial pressure. We have kids living in the hospital for two years."

"A mother having to give up work and father going part-time is a common scenario. Parents often try to work online from hospital, to keep something going. A family I worked with, both parents had to give up work. Their child was in ICU for over a year and neither of them could work, they had another child."



"Couples with higher incomes often have bigger mortgages, so with the loss of one or more income, the debt of a heretofore financially comfortable family can spiral very quickly out of control."

"Think of the profile of kids who are in hospital – they are usually in the very younger age group and the families have probably got a new mortgage and a new house, starting school bills and with other siblings. It is probably at the most expensive time of their life,"

"Parents of long-stay paediatric patients are still their primary carers. Not only do they want to be at their child's bedside, they must be there. The hospital system depends on it.



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"You are not allowed to leave – you can't just disappear for a week. You are still responsible for your child in hospital, the nurses aren't there to mind them."

"There is also lengthy training for parents to prepare to bring home a child who may be "peg fed", where liquid nutrition is tubed into the stomach, and/or have a tracheostomy, that involves placement of a tube through a hole in the neck into the windpipe"

Yet they are not carers in the eyes of the State when it comes to support payments. Nor will they qualify for unemployment benefit – even though they have lost their job or, at least, their income – because they are in no position to be a "jobseeker". They're in a black hole as regards State financial assistance.



For one family, their  $\leq 1,500$  monthly rent and all the other regular bills had to be paid, as well as the additional expenses. With one of them in Dublin all the time, "it was like having two families",

"My husband would come up one night a week because he would miss us. He would maybe bring his mother up, and my other daughter would come up as well." But trying to give the family time together in this way came at the cost of higher petrol bills.

The hospital's parents' accommodation cost €10 a night, until that was waived after the first four months. With no access to cooking facilities, it was take-aways, eating out or the hospital canteen – all costly and mostly unhealthy. With all that's going on, self-care is a challenge."

"The money stops coming in and then you have all these bills to pay," says mum. In addition to what's going on in hospital, "you're on a constant fight as well to try to get everything in place to get home", such as housing and a home-care package.

Sarah Mc Namara and pupils of her swim school Aqua Elite at the Strand Hotel Limerick once again did a fantastic fundraiser which not only saw them improve their swimming technique but also raise €4,568 in the process.

This brings the total Sarah and Aqua Elite have raised for us over the past 3 years to  $\leq 13,665 -$ which is just amazing.

Sarah McNamara, Liz Griffin and Niamh Blake completed the National Swim a Mile challenge in UL Arena while 57 children swam an average of 800 metres each during the month of April in Energize Leisure Centre (total of 45,000 metres or 28miles)

It was also great to hear from Sarah that she was familiar with a family that had received our support earlier this year and could see 1<sup>st</sup> hand the lift it gave that family as they coped with looking after their sick child. A fantastic achievement and well done and thank you to all the participants and their supporters.



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
