It's a great feeling for us when somebody contacts us to say they'd like to organise an event and donate all the funds raised to Cliona's – that happened numerous times in 2018 and we're more than grateful to each and every one of you who were involved in the fundraisers.

We're proud to say that we are still the only charity in Ireland that provides financial assistance for non-medical expenses for families with seriously sick children! On several occasions over the last 12 months, we've been told even by the medical profession how invaluable Cliona's service is to some of the families they encounter in their work, again it's a pleasure to be acknowledged! We'd like to thank John (King) for his time spent with Cliona's over the last 2 years, his knowledge, research abilities and patience is worth anything – best wishes for the future John!

In excess of €600,000 has been raised by Limericks Live 95FM 95 Stop Tour for Limerick Kids thanks to the generosity of the people of Limerick over the past 8 years. and we were really excited to be part of this exciting venture.

This year's tour took place officially week commencing September 17th, with the Live 95FM 95 Stop Tour Team out in force across Limerick City and County, however, there were many fundraising events throughout the summer and beyond.

Some of the events included The Limerick Class Car Show at Limerick Racecourse The Jeff Power Memorial Soccer Tournament, Family Fun Day in UL Arena and the CARI Pop up Shop in the Parkway Shopping Centre.

We were directly involved through the Annual Cliona's Foundation Cycle.,an 80's Disco night in 13/14, and a Horse racing competition with the support of Limerick Race Track.

Communities, businesses and schools across Limerick held fundraising events including Coffee Mornings, Bingo Nights, Welly Wednesday, Fun Cycles, Walks, Pyjama Parties, Raffles, and so much more all in aid of the Live 95FM 95 Stop Tour.

We were also delighted that our very good supporter Metis Life designated their Monthly Morning run in September to the cause. It was a great experience working with the other charities and the team at Live 95fm in the run up to and during the official fundraising week at numerous events. We are really excited to hear what the total amount raised will be when the official announcement is made live on air on Christmas Eve. We know that whatever the amount raised, it will make a huge difference to our families.



Tagging for Cliona's Foundation

We were delighted to be the beneficiary of the inaugural CPL Regional Rumble in September which saw their Dublin Tag team take on a combined Regional Tag Team (comprised of Limerick, Cork and Galway team members). This was the first event of its kind in which internal CPL teams faced off against each other, bidding for the honor of being CPL Tag Rugby Champions. Both Teams took to the field in the excellent UL North Campus, and in a very sporting contest the regional team shaded the game by a single Golden Try in extra time!

It was an afternoon of great entertainment and we were delighted to accept a cheque in the amount of €1,250.













Launch of Landmark report "Too Dear to Visit"

A landmark report published Wednesday 26th September and commissioned by Cliona's Foundation Too Dear to Visit' reveals for the first time, the extent of the often-invisible costs of caring for a child with a life-limiting condition. There are approximately 4,000 children living with life-limiting conditions across Ireland today. This report shows how non-medical expenses including overnight accommodation, travel costs, additional childcare and extra household bills can amount to become an enormous financial burden on families already under immense emotional stress.

The report highlights that many families are spending upwards of €10,000 to €11,000 per annum which can represent as much as one-third of their post-tax income. The total burden faced by families at a national level is estimated to be several millions of euro each year. The report highlights that travel and related costs which can range from €1,400 to €8,000 in one year are a major part of the cost of caring for a child with a life-limiting condition.

Speaking about this study, the lead author Professor Charles Normand, Professor of Health Policy and Management at Trinity College Dublin (TCD) said:

"This report exposes the punitive financial burden on families caring for a seriously ill child. Very often parents will have to take on a caring role for their child, resulting in a loss of employment and income, significantly impacting their finances, while simultaneously trying to meet unforeseen outgoings such as travel to hospital appointments, hospital parking, overnight accommodation and other noncare related expenses. It makes no sense to provide good medical treatment and no support for nonmedical expenses. These expenses are just as much a part of the cost of their child's care pathway as the treatment itself. Despite the outstanding efforts of Cliona's Foundation to support families in dire need, its' funds and work fall far short of being able to tackle the scale of demand, which is evident from our work. No charity should be expected to fill this funding gap. There needs to be a proper state funded system and process which families can readily access for exceptional non-medical expenses when they need it."

When a child is born or diagnosed with a life-limiting illness or sustains a serious injury, parents are thrust into an enormously stressful and threatening world and yet widespread evidence shows how important their role is in their child's recovery as well as limiting the impact for siblings or other family members. The report sets out three key recommendations:

- 1. Government to establish a 'looking after a child with life-limiting illness' grant.
- 2. The establishment of a national database on families caring for children with a life-limiting condition.
- Cliona's Foundation to tailor its support services to meet the unique needs of the families including partnerships with services companies to provide a range of assistance to the families.

Cliona's Foundation has already engaged with government ministers and Departments to make progress on these recommendations and hope to make further progress in 2019

A super group of young people working in New York organised and led by the fantastic Clara Garry from Co, Limerick undertook to raise funds for Cliona's Foundation by running a 10km in Central Park New York on August 19th.

Clashing with the All Ireland Hurling Final this group tore up the course to make sure they got to see the game but also performed unbelievably in raising a total of \$2,638 in the process.

It was wonderful to receive this amount but also very special to know that the purple of Cliona's Foundation was being worn with pride In New York by such a great crew. Well done and thank you Clara and all your great friends.

It is very special and uplifting for us to receive updates from families and I think you will agree that Clodagh is looking fantastic and just beautiful.



What a journey we have been on with Keeva Delaney and her family for the past number of months which led to the publication and launch of "The Dolls Complaints" book and its distribution through Dunnes Stores in early December .

We never envisaged that there would be a book with all donations going to Cliona's Foundation on the shelves for Christmas and we are privileged to have been part of what has been an amazing story.

It al started with a phone call from 11 year old Keeva's mum Maurita advising that her other daughter Sarah's class had an end of school year jumble sale and that Cliona's Foundation had been selected (as nominated by Sarah) as the beneficiary. Maurita had come across our leaflet 2 years ago, was touched by what we did and said she would support us at some stage.













She then proceeded to share with us how Keeva had written a few stories about her dolls, illustrated the stories and how there may be a potential for a book with Cliona's Foundation as the beneficiary.

The rest is history but what followed was numerous meetings with the wonderful Delaney family, introducing them to the designers in CUBE of which Brendan Ring is the Director and "The Dolls' Complaints "became a reality.

But getting it into the market was going to be the real challenge or so we thought. Keeva had other ideas however and contacted Anne Heffernan of Dunnes Stores directly. After meeting with Keeva and Cliona's Foundation Anne offered to stock the book in Dunnes Stores instore and online – all for nothing.















The book came off the press the end of November. It is a beautifully written, illustrated and produced piece with dolls stories that resonate with young and old. The dolls owner is in hospital and while there her dolls are being cared for by her sister. But not very well and the dolls send letters of complaints to hospital to their owner pleading with her to make things right. Starting with it's Launch by Miriam O Callaghan to book signings in Carlow, Dublin with Miriam O Callaghan and Limerick with Joe Schmidt. There was also an appearance on Ireland Am and other TV coverage on Virgin One and RTE and numerous radio and newspaper interviews across the country. In addition there has been unbelievable support and video testimonials from different sporting personalities, celebrities, bloggers and even the gold medal Olympian Justin Caitlin. The book has even been shipped to Dubai, New Zealand and pictured in Sydney Harbour.

The 2nd Annual Cliona's Foundation Walking challenge took place on Saturday 6th October and with the weather being more then favourable the trek on the Paradise Hill Loop with a trip up to "The Pinnacle" was just fantastic.

More than 50 walkers participated and with blue skies overhead the trek saw us departing from Anglesborough Community Centre at 9.30am and walking the main road for a short distance, We then moved on to forest track, climbing slightly with soft and wet ground conditions which were challenging at times but not impossible. The Paradise Hill Loop is on the western end of the Galtymore Mountains in Co.
