Camino for Cliona's memorable trip for TY **Students**

The 2nd Camino for Cliona's took place across two trips in May & June when a group of 102 students, teachers and group leaders flew to Santiago in Northern Spain to undertake a huge personal challenge - the 117kms Sarria to Santiago leg of the Camino.

This special trip took place after the group collectively raised over €116,000 for families caring for seriously sick children in Ireland. They then walked along the infamous Camino in solidarity with these families over 5 days. Along the way each member of the group carried the families in their hearts as well as their loved ones at home. The effect on each participant was profound.



102 Transition Year students took part this year from 22 schools across the Country including Dublin, Cork, Waterford, Cork, Kerry, & Carlow The students had not met each other in person until they travelled to the airport on the morning of the flight, having only met through Zoom throughout the year. However, friendships were formed at lightning speed as their collective adventure began and the chat, dancing, singing, support, mentoring & friendships developed amongst the group really was very special to witness The sense of purpose and accomplishment between the group made for emotional scenes as they entered the square despite the muscle aches & blisters.

These were an amazing group of young people who dug very deep, carried each other throughout the week and represented Cliona's in such a positive way that Team Cliona's are so proud of them. The pride & emotion was further enhanced when other walkers

on route relayed their experience of meeting them at various stages on route & who praised them so much for their engagement, attitude & efforts. Wonderful ambassadors for Cliona's.

We are delighted to say both are doing very well to date & to celebrate the liverversary they put wheels on a cot & pushed it the 22kms from the Byrne house to the Fentons house. It was a challenging but unbelievable event with all of the community jumping on board taking turns to push & participate, making donations, supporting a raffle and much more resulting in a staggering €10,355 being raised for Cliona's.

It was both an emotional but hugely gratifying to travel to meet Emily, her family, the Fentons & all the community that made this happen to accept the cheque on what was appropriately Mothers day. The warmth & love from the community was palpable.

generously shared their story in public, to raise awareness and to generate support for Cliona's. We are always so grateful to them.








